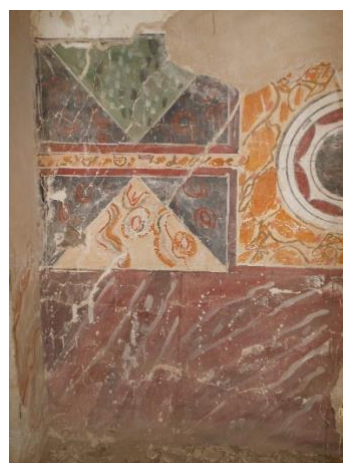
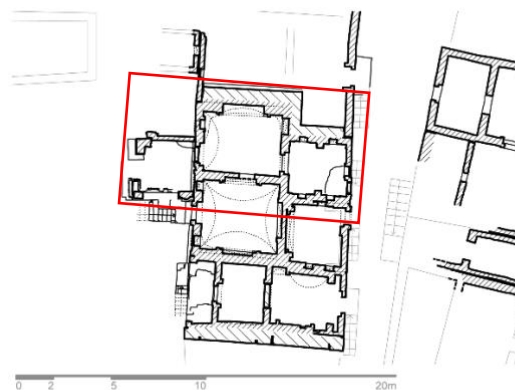

Number of niches	West room: 1 in the west wall, 2 in the east wall, 1 alcove in the north wall; east room: 2 in the north, 2 in the south wall, and 1 in the east wall
Decoration	West room: west, north, and east wall: painted imitations of horizontal (bottom) and vertical alabaster and red porphyry(?) slabs (above), borderline of wall and roof: thick red line with yellow dashes (garland?) (below), contorted red and green band (above); alcove: horizontal slabs of alabaster bordered by red lines; south wall: imitation of porphyry slabs (bottom), <i>opus sectile</i> (above); east room not decorated
